What to Bring

Remember all gear bait and tackle is always provided and your guide will clean and bag your fish for you at the end of your trip.

1. Fishing License. You will need either a Washington or Oregon Freshwater Fishing license with catch record card depending on the river you're fishing. You may also need a Columbia River Enhancement if you're fishing on the Columbia or one of it's tributaries.

2. Food. Remember you'll be on the water at least 8 hours on most trips and you might need a snack or lunch to keep your energy levels up for reeling in fish all day! Your guides will have water and sodas on the boat, but if you prefer something specific please bring it along.

3. Clothing. The weather is very unpredictable in the Pacific Northwest .

We always recommend rain gear or waders, warm layered clothing, water proof shoes or boots. Sunglasses and sun block are always a good idea when you're on the water. Water proof hats and gloves are also a good idea.

4.Camera. You'll want to be sure to have your camera/video phone ready for to capture the memories you'll make on your guided trip. If you're a professional photographer or hobbyist bring your gear and we'll be sure to provide the scenery and fish!

STURGEON

Columbia River Sturgeon

Sturgeon fishing may be so popular due to the sheer size of these prehistoric monstrous fish! There are two types of sturgeon fishing on the Columbia River . The first is for 'keeper' sturgeon. These are fish between 42 and 60 inches, which is still much bigger than your average salmon or steelhead. Sturgeon are a true NW delicacy often referred to as 'poor man's lobster.' It won't take very many of these in the boat to fill the freezer for a whole year!

Trophy sturgeon are over 60 inches and can easily range over 10ft in length. You can't keep them, but can get a good picture of your catch in the water and share the memory of catching these famous, giant fish for years to come!
